This report, which was developed by an expert committee of the Institute of Medicine, reviews the first three services listed above. It is intended to assist policymakers by providing syntheses of the best evidence available about the effectiveness of these services and by estimating the cost to Medicare of covering them. For each service or condition examined, the committee commissioned a review of the scientific literature that was presented and discussed at a public workshop. As requested by Congress, this report includes explicit estimates only of costs to Medicare, not costs to

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beneficiaries, their families, or others. It also does not include cost-effectiveness analyses. That is, the extent of the benefits relative to the costs to Medicare-or to society generally-is not evaluated for the services examined. The method for estimating Medicare costs follows the generic estimation practices of the Congressional Budget Office (CBO). The objective was to provide Congress with estimates that were based on familiar procedures and could be compared readily with earlier and later CBO estimates. For each condition or service, the estimates are intended to suggest the order of magnitude of the costs to Medicare of extending coverage, but the estimates could be considerably higher or lower than what Medicare might actually spend were coverage policies changed. The estimates cover the five-year period 2000-2004. In addition to the conclusions about specific coverage issues, the report examines some broader concerns about the processes for making coverage decisions and about the research and organizational infrastructure for these decisions. It also briefly examines the limits of coverage as a means of improving health services and outcomes and the limits of evidence as a means of resolving policy and ethical questions.

Background The success rate of implants in health patients is remarkably high, however, it is lower in immunodeficiency patients. As one of the most common immunodeficiency disorders, systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE) influence bone metabolism directly and indirectly. To date, there is no guideline on the placement of implants in immunodeficiency patients,

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including SLE patients. This paper focus on the implant rehabilitation in patients with systemic lupus erythematosus. Aim/HypothesisThe aim of this paper is to discuss if dental implant is an option even in patient with systemic lupus erythematosus.Materials and Methods Patient Selection: A 35-year-old women with a 3-year history of SLE and 3-year history of glucocorticoid was selected, and her SLE has been well controlled for 2 years. As a nurse in ICU, she gets insufficient sleep. She missed one teeth 6 month ago. On exam, she presented with atrophy depression in the left central incisor (21) region, and the cone beam computerized tomography (CBCT) scan showed atrophic maxilla in the 21 site. The bone volume is about 5.0X17.6mm. There is no periodontitis nor decays.Surgical Stage: During the clinical procedure, the patient keeps taking the glucocorticoid as usual. Under local anesthesia, the flap was elevated and an implant (Nobel PMC 4.3X11.5mm) was inserted, then the cover screw was connected. After that, Bio-oss(0.25g) and Bio-gide were implanted in the buccal and the flap was closed within tension free. A fixed temporary prostheses supported by adjacent teeth was applied. Results Postoperative CBCT shows the bone graft and the ideal location of the implant, as well as sufficient peri-implant bone. After the operation, regular follow-up visits were carried out to evaluate healing, keep oral hygiene and adjust the temporary prostheses. The implant was inserted 3 months ago, and according to the recent X-ray, the implant formed an ideal osseointegration. We plan to re-shape the gingiva in a minimally invasive way in the near future, and finally restore the left central incisor by all-ceramic restoration. Conclusions and Clinical ImplicationsUnder SLE, the general and oral condition should be evaluated, as infections are potential threats for osteointegration. Besides that, a standard procedure is important, and a minimally invasive way is necessary. Moreover, regular follow-up visits are

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required. As glucocorticoid is vital for the patients with SLE, we found that they can be kept during the clinical procedure. In conclusion, implants can be applied to patients with SLE.
